

6th grade teamwork / leadership exercise #1

In your group, follow these instructions to build a carrying web:

You will need:

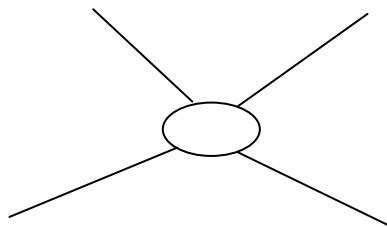
- A small rubber ring
- A tape measure
- String
- Teamwork

1. Find your rubber hoop.

This will be the center circle of your carrying web.

2. Take 4 individual pieces of twine about **8 feet long**. Tie each piece of twine to the hoop. (The four individual pieces of twine should be tied several inches apart)

Your carrying web will need to look like this:



Your task will be:

- Each student needs to hold the end of one of the pieces of rope.
- Use the carrying web to scoop up a soccer ball from a hula hoop
- Carry it to the other hula hoop
- Place the ball in the hoop.

You may begin to talk about how you will do this. However, you may not practice.

Chicken, Fox, Farmer, Grain Problem

A farmer has a bag of grain, a chicken, and a fox. The farmer must travel to the other side of the river in his boat but the boat can only hold the farmer and one other item. If the chicken and grain are left together, the chicken will eat the grain. If the fox and chicken are left together, the fox will eat the chicken. How can the farmer get the chicken, fox, grain, and himself to the other side of the river?
